<p>Outcomes to date:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Holy Trinity Awarded Gold Active Surrey. This award recognises our excellent sporting program. The award takes note of our high quality curriculum PE, our inclusivity, our broad range of clubs and the volume of fixtures undertaken throughout the year. The award was underpinned by statistics gathered throughout the year by our excellent sports co-ordinator. More information about this award is on our website. • Improved emailing and parent communications due to efficient email systems that keep parents up to date with fixtures and any changes to times and dates • We have purchased a range of equipment to support clubs and curriculum PE. The purchase of 50 new tennis rackets has led to a tennis club being established and tennis for all as part of our summer term sports curriculum. Year 3 and Year4 children qualified for County Tennis competition. • Data collection on sport uptake carried out to help identify gaps in our sports program and gaps issues addressed. • Young leaders running lunchtime activities successfully; this has been monitored and overseen by lunchtime supervisors. • Staff attended training in gymnastics, primary sport and differentiation in PE. We are now delivering high quality lessons across both sites.
