Sustainability and Outcomes to date:

We believe that everything we do with our Sports Premium money should directly benefit our children and create a sustainable model that can be carried forward for many years

- Pewley Down has been awarded the Star Mark for infant school sports. This award recognises the school's commitment to high quality sporting opportunities for all of its children.
- Holy Trinity awarded 'Gold' by Active Surrey for their commitment to delivering high quality sports. This award recognises the work done in lessons and through extra-curricular provision and emphasises sport for all
- Teachers report increased confidence in delivering high quality lessons
- 70 competitive fixtures are timetabled in the academic year across both sites
- Dance training for staff across both sites
- Change for Life Club running with high engagement and positive responses in teacher evaluations
- Around 175 children to compete for the school during academic year
- 75% of all children participating in school sports clubs free of charge
- Over 20 free sports clubs run on a weekly basis over both sites
- Sporting calendar fixed
- Senior management and teaching staff report fewer behavioural incidents involving year 3 and 4 children during break and lunch times
- Holy Trinity vulnerability index and sports questionnaire have been analysed and specific children highlighted for targeted involvement
- Teachers using data to target less active children in various opportunities
