Homework: Pupils need to complete the tenses homework in their Reading Journals, changing verbs from the present to the past tense.

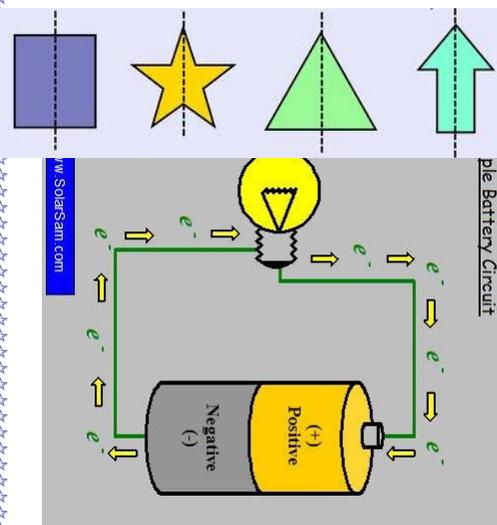
Resources Request:

In Maths this week we have been learning about how to measure and draw angles using a protractor. The children have been applying this knowledge to work out missing angles in a triangle.
