Maths/Topic: In maths next week we will be thinking more about data collection. After the launch of our 'Guildford Project', the children will be designing their own investigations to do in Guildford High Street. They'll be working on these in groups, will collect their data on Thursday/Friday and then present the data the following week.

English: After spending some time looking at WWF leaflets, we identified persuasive features that leaflets use. We had a go at drafting our own leaflets as part of our endangered animal campaign. Next week we will be editing the writing for the leaflets.

RE: This week we thought about four historical figures: Desmond Tutu, Mother Theresa, Dr. Barnardo and Brother Andrew. We considered why these people did the things they did and concluded that it was because they read the Bible and were perhaps trying to live out some of the things that the Early Church did. In RE next week we'll continue to think about our overarching theme 'What would Jesus do?'
