


Joust to let you know...




In English this week the focus was rhyme as we wrote our Henry VIII wives raps and songs. The children have been very creative and we have enjoyed listening to them.

Science: After baking their own bread, the children were asked by King Henry VIII to investigate which type of bread, out of white, granary, brown and soda would last the longest without going mouldy. We looked at ways of stopping mould and considered Henry's problem of not having refrigeration. The children then designed and carried out their own experiments to see which conditions and which types of bread were best for keeping the mould at bay.
