## This week...

We started the week meeting the baker (Thomas Farynor) and his wife who told us all about how the Great Fire of London started. We listened to the story and then had a go at sequencing the events of the story using time connectives to link our sentences (next, after, finally, meanwhile). In art we made Tudor houses on black paper using white art straws. We enjoyed a lovely afternoon at the Wild Place this week. The children heard the story of Jesus healing the 10 lepers and we played a game of 'it', thinking about how it might feel to run away from someone or leave them out. We thought of ideas of how we could include people. An exciting D.T. Session involved designing and making their own pulley system to transport water to the fire!

## Maths corner

This week we have been thinking about measuring. We had a go estimating the length of a metre using strips of paper. We also practised using a ruler to measure in cm. A particularly challenging activity was trying to draw a Tudor house that was a specific height with windows of a specific size. See if you can practise measuring things around your house. Can you order a list of objects by length or height? If you need a trickier challenge ask a friend to describe a picture to you using lengths and heights in cm and see if you can draw it using a ruler!
