


This week...

Maths

This week we have continued learning about 2-digit and 3-digit numbers. We used dienes apparatus (tens and units) to help us understand what the digits represent. We have used dienes blocks (hundreds, tens and units equipment) to make numbers e.g. 149.



At home have a go at breaking numbers into tens and units or even into hundreds, tens and units. For example, choose a number such as 72 and ask your child how many tens and units there are.

English

We all enjoyed the story of 'Mrs Armitage and the Big wave.' We were inspired to write a letter to Mrs Armitage with many suggestions of additions and improvements to her surf board.

Science

After finding out about Mrs Armitage and her fabulous floating surfboard we decided to investigate what else would float and sink. Ask your child what happened to the lego, the coin the orange with/without its peel, the carrot with the cocktail sticks, and much more!
