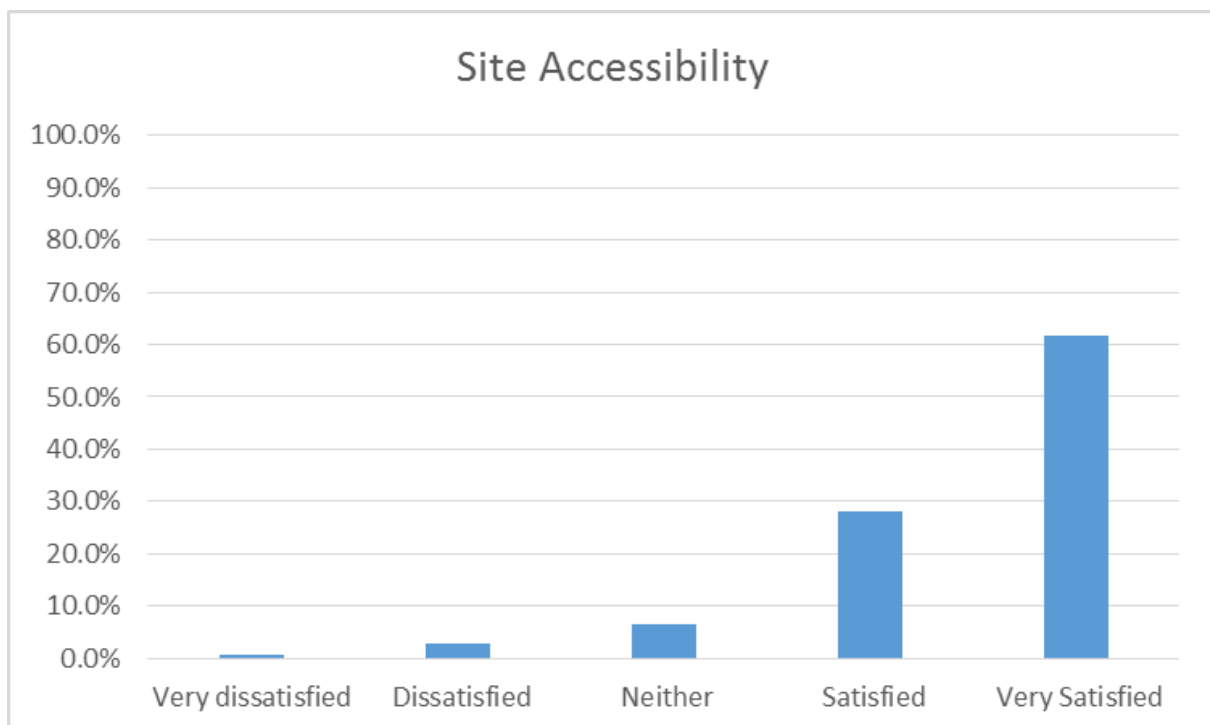
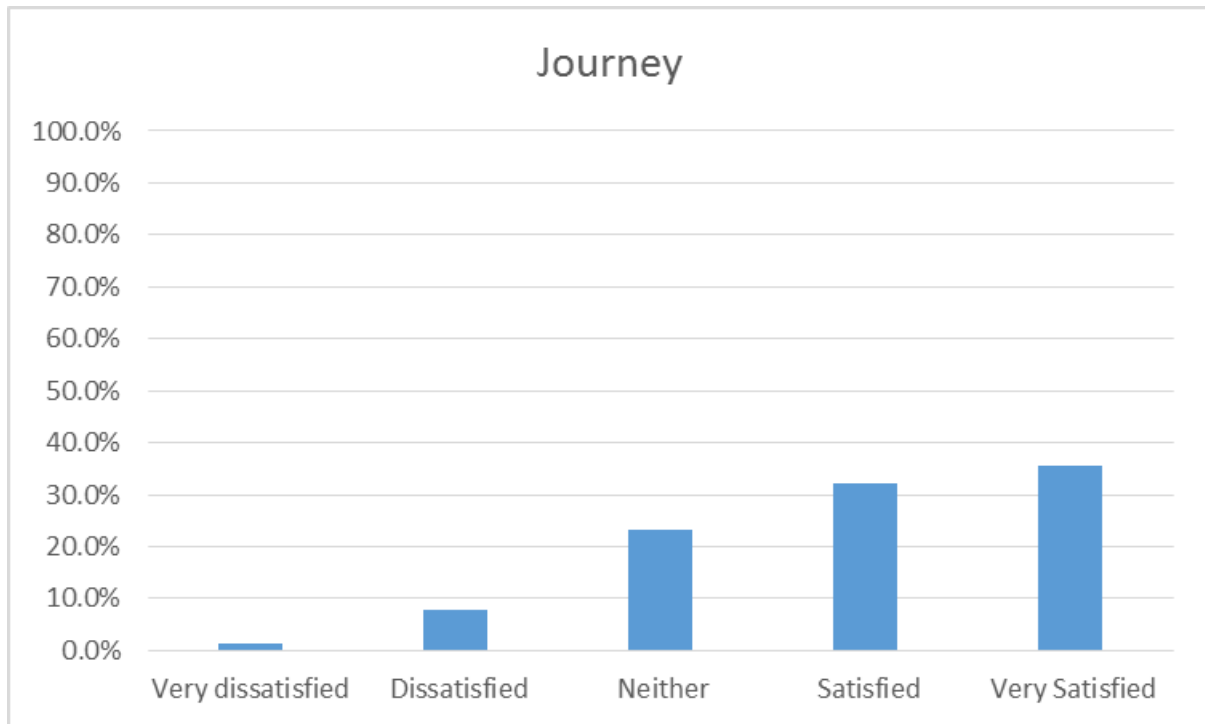


Results from Parent Survey 2016

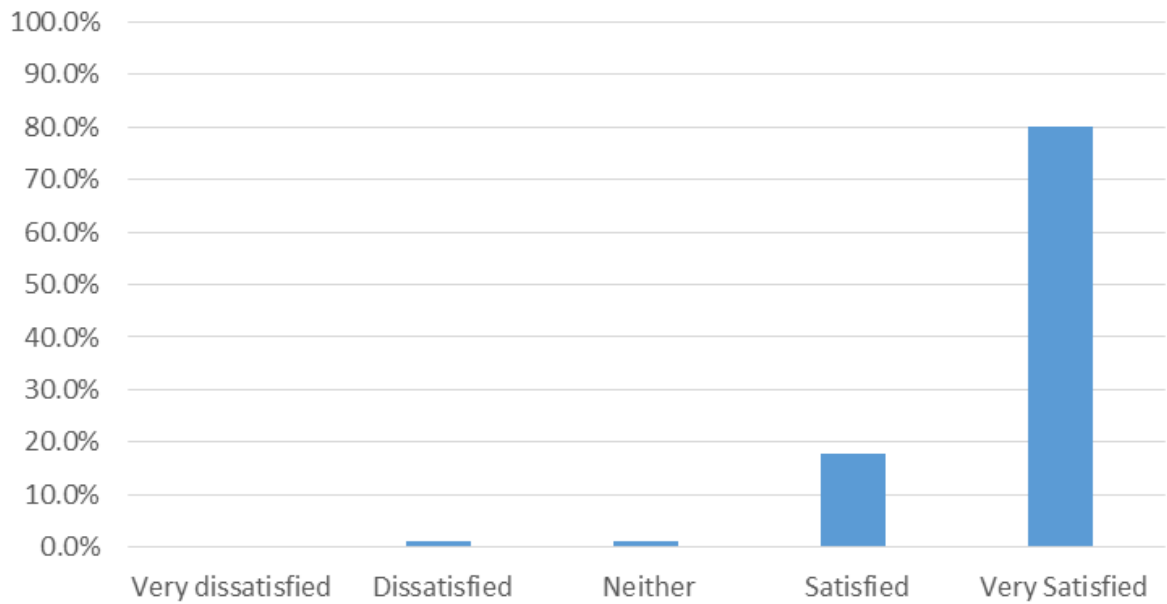
Summary and key findings

- There were 170 responses to the survey from a total of around 460 families with children at the school.
- There was an overwhelmingly positive response to questions about respect, inclusion and a lack of prejudice or discrimination.
- One particular area of concern reflected parents' difficulty with parking at both sites at the start and end of the school day. With 36 responses commenting on this problem, it was by far the most notable issue raised. This will helpfully inform ongoing discussions with Guildford Borough Council about parking and road safety at both sites.
- There were 105 responses relating to before and after school provision and these were very positive about the quality of relationships with staff and the balance of activities provided.
- Five responses asked that we consider facilitating homework activities at Clubs+ and PUPS and this is something that we will explore further.
- While most responses were satisfied with the type and quantity of food available at Clubs+ and PUPS, some responses indicated a wish to see a larger meal provided. This would have to be balanced against trying to keep costs down for parents.
- There were many comments that provided really helpful feedback for the school and several individual suggestions have already resulted in a response and a change in our practice. We are extremely grateful to all the parents who took the time to complete the survey and have been encouraged by the many positive comments received.
- The survey results will be discussed further at the next meeting of the "Every Child Matters" governors' committee meeting in May.

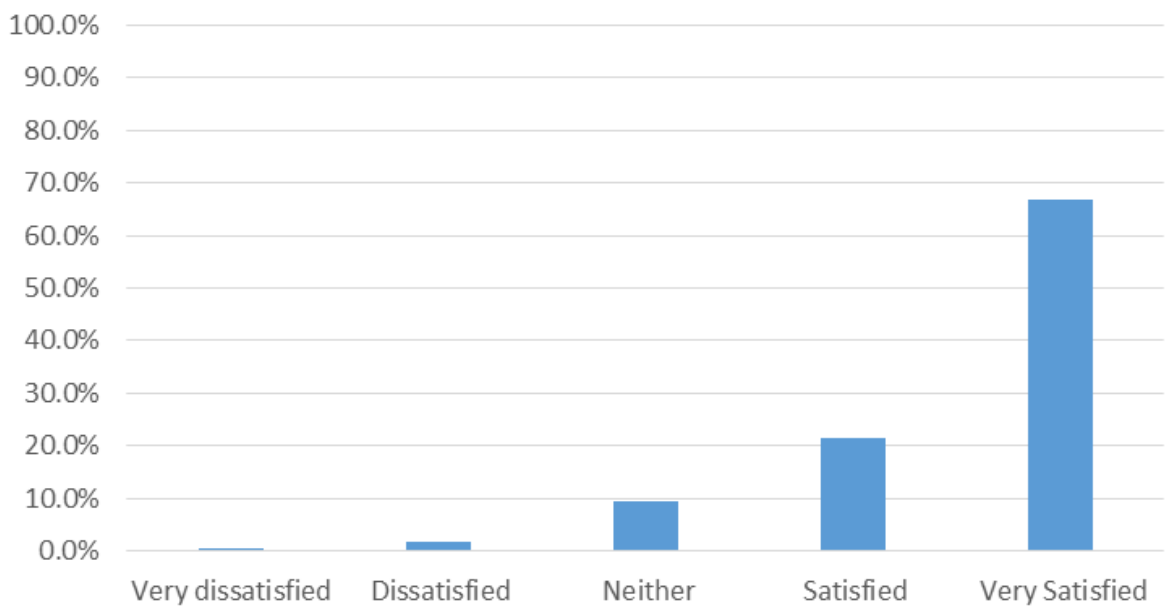

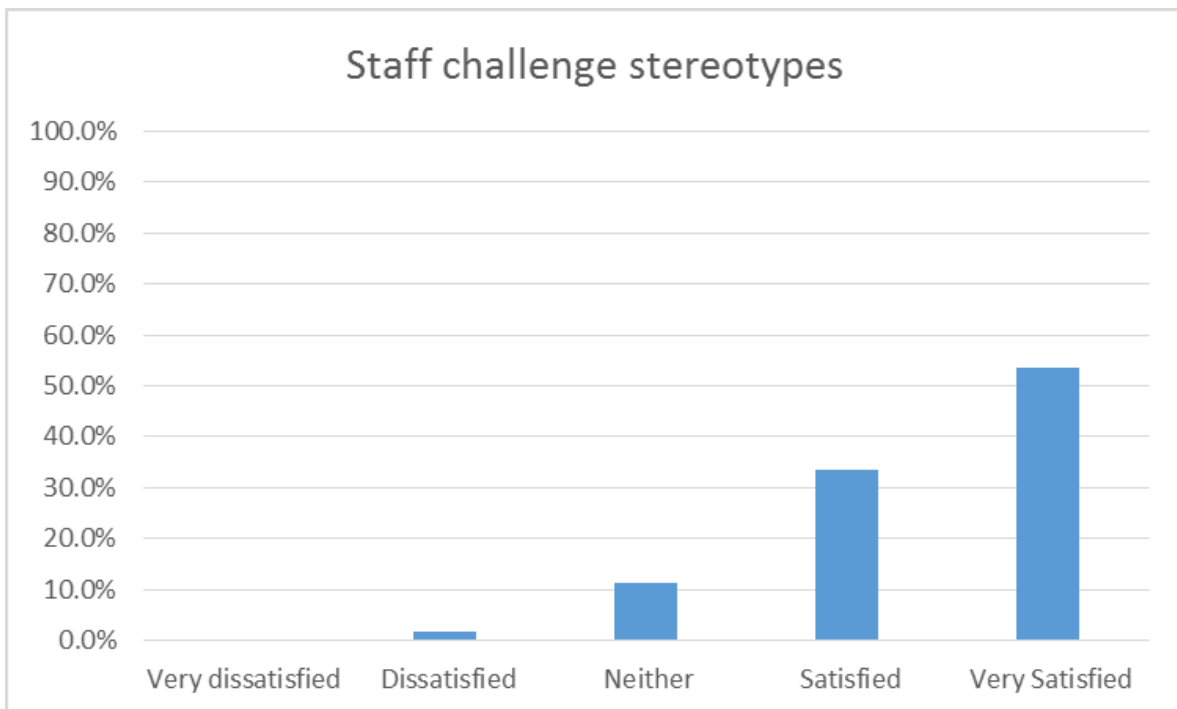
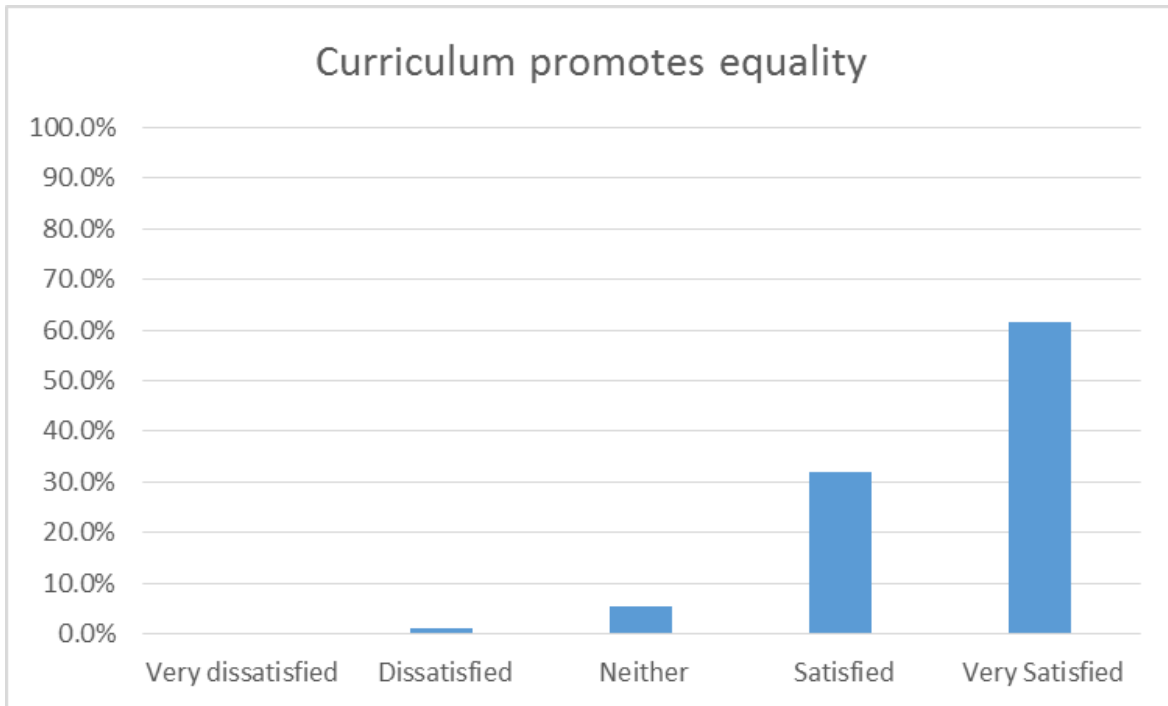


Children treated with respect

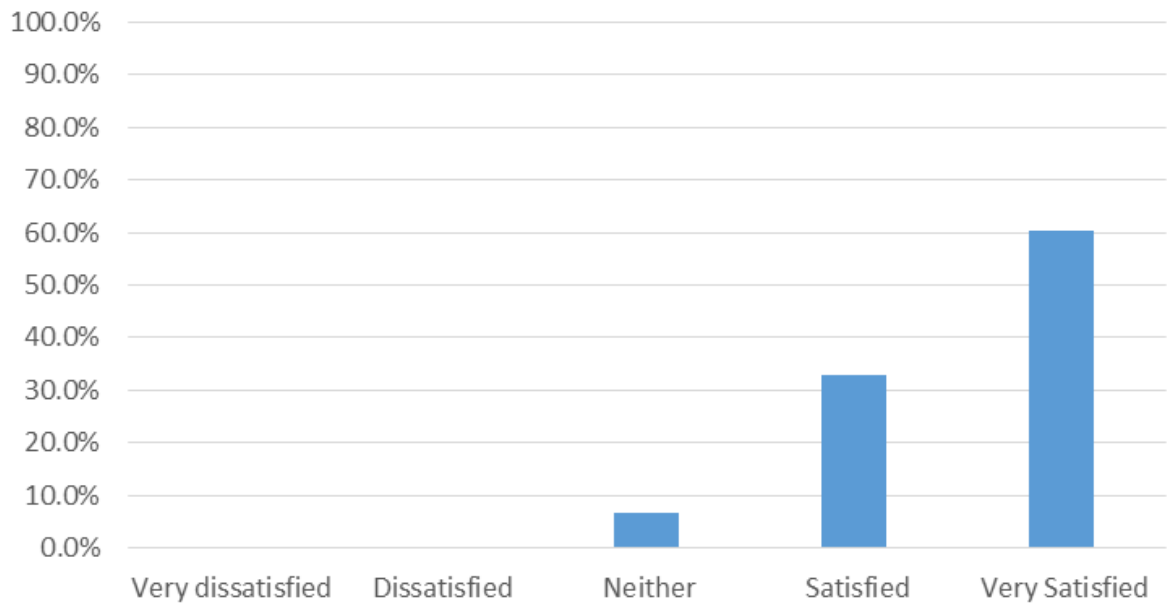


Children treated fairly and equally

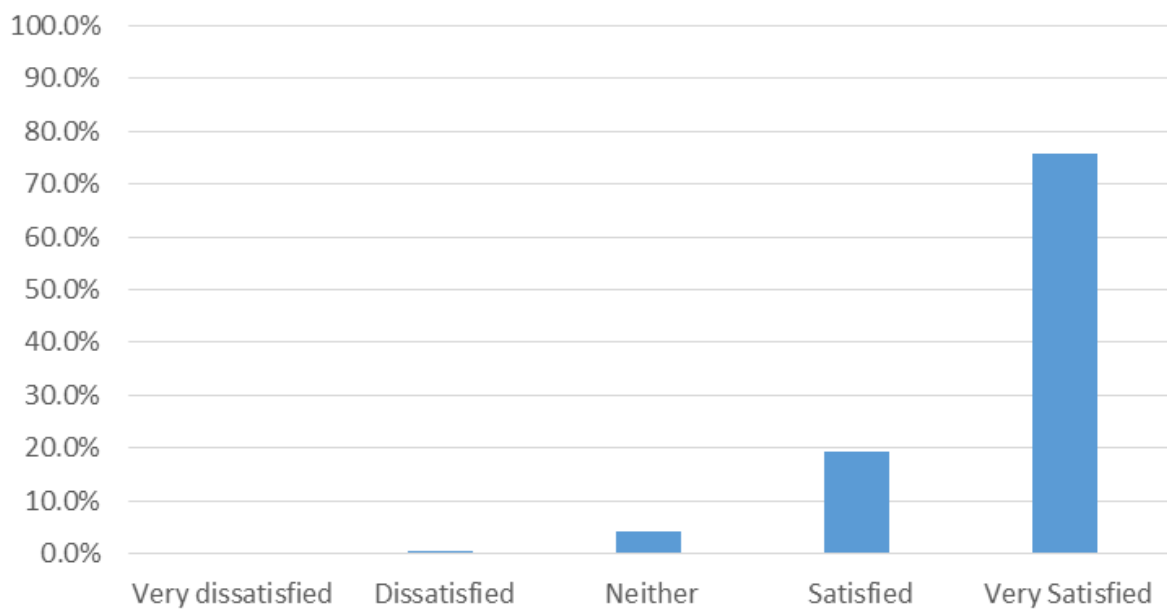


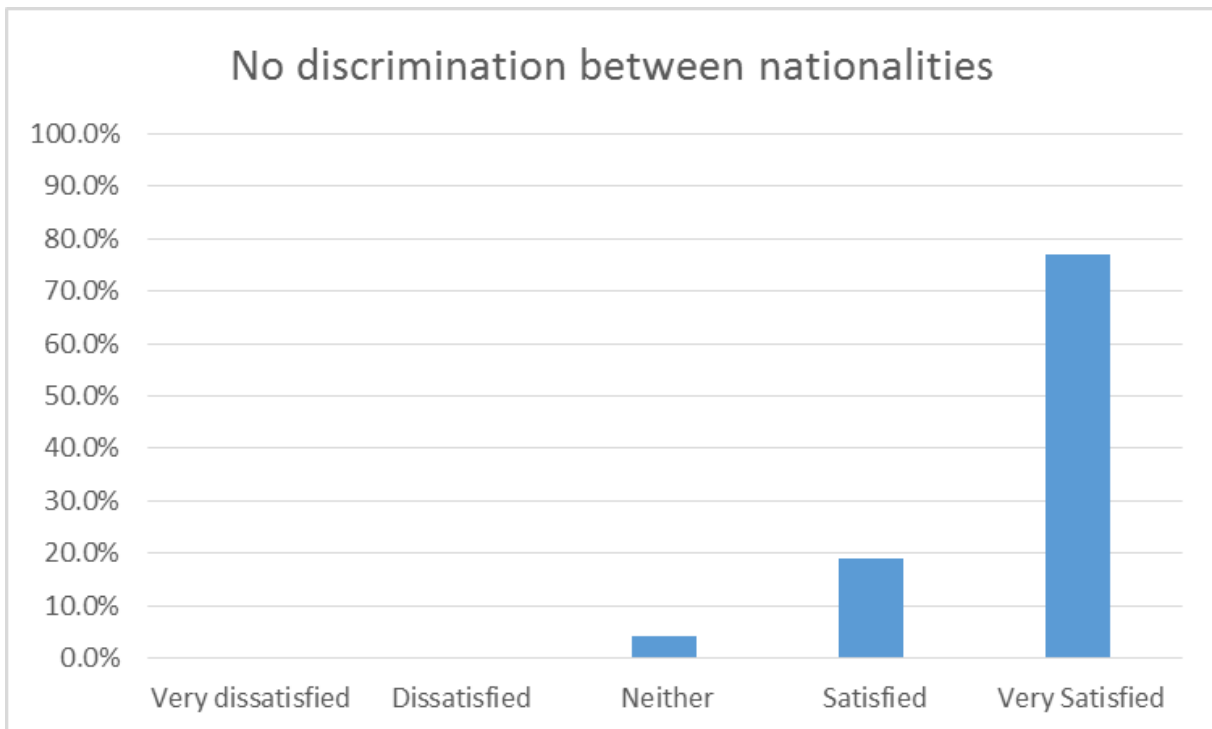
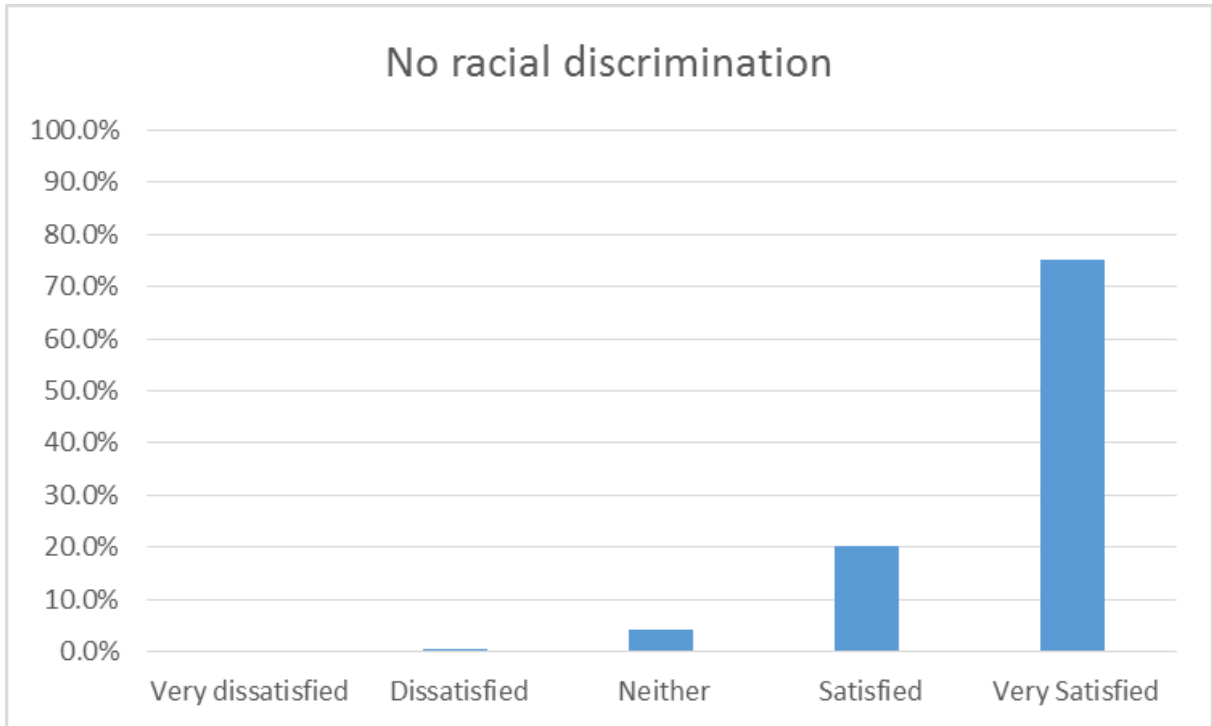


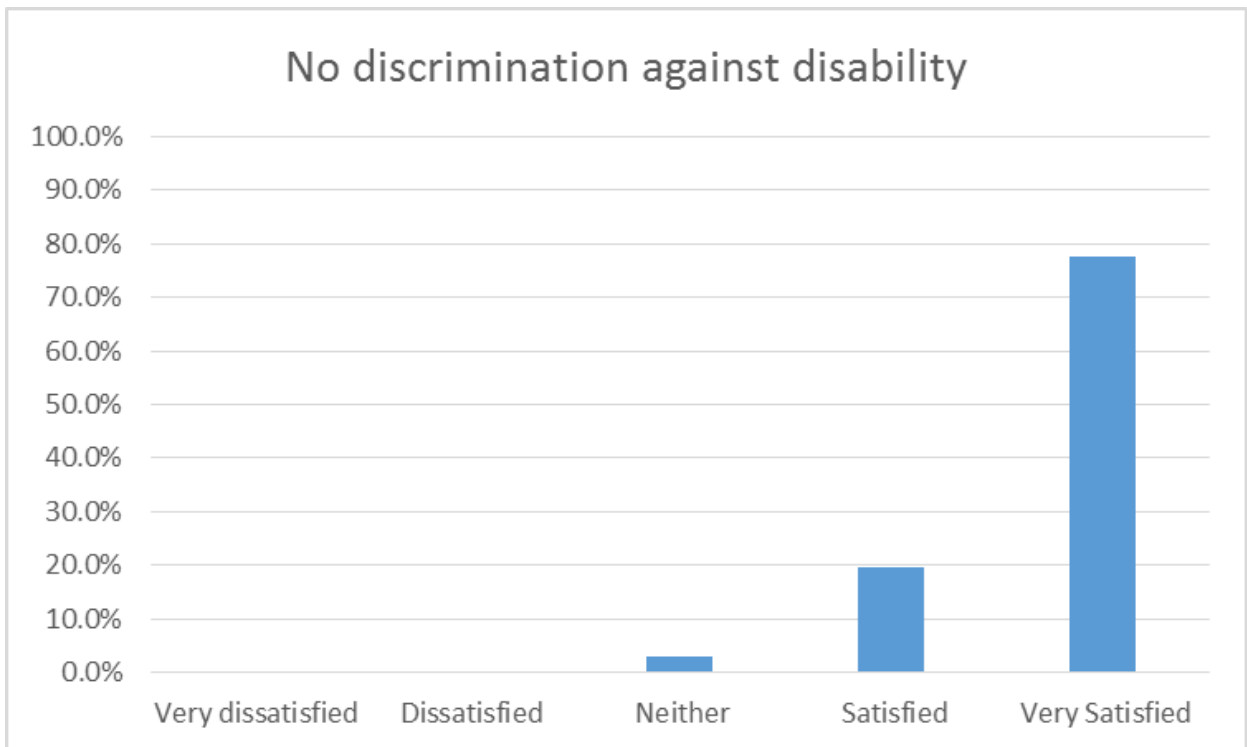
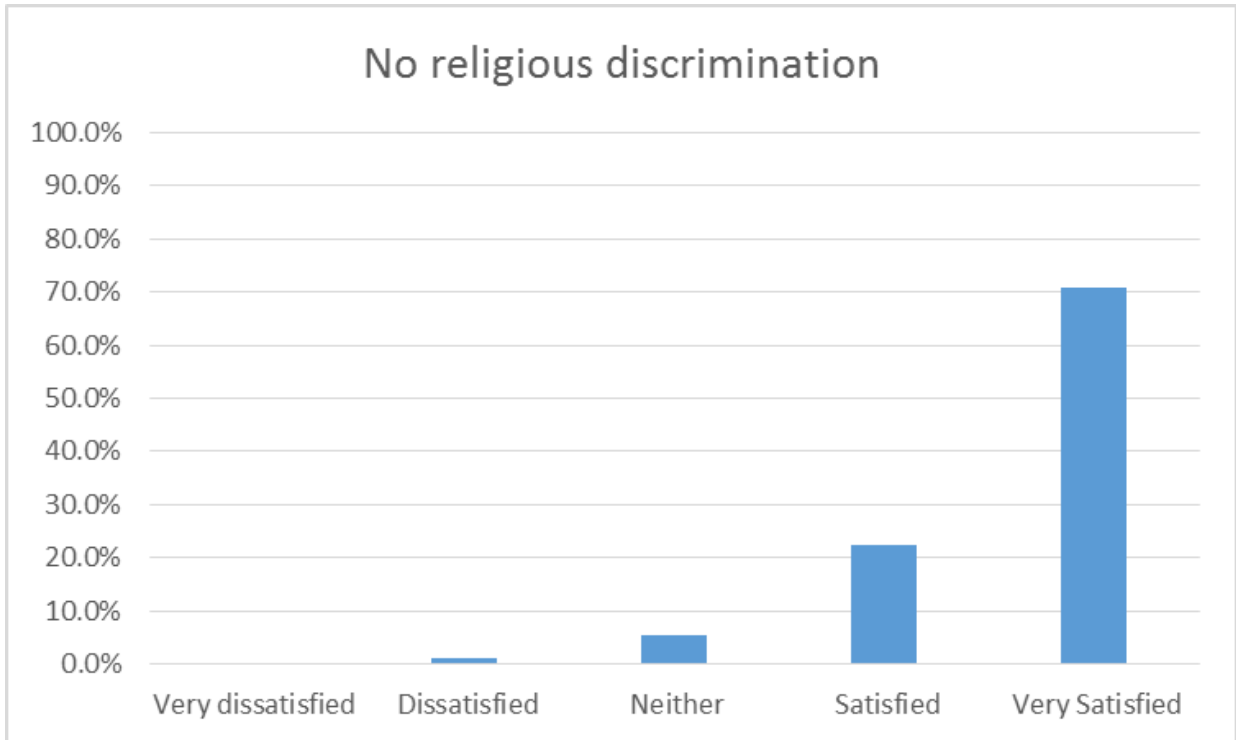

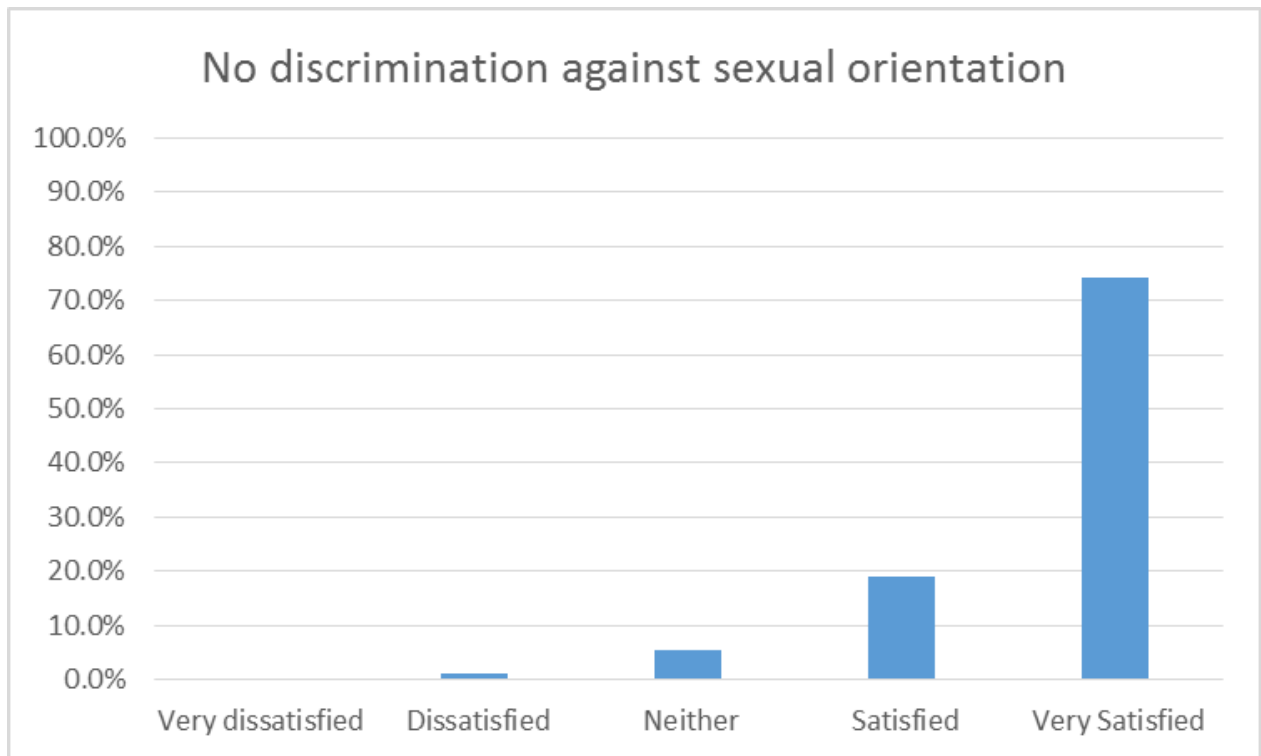
