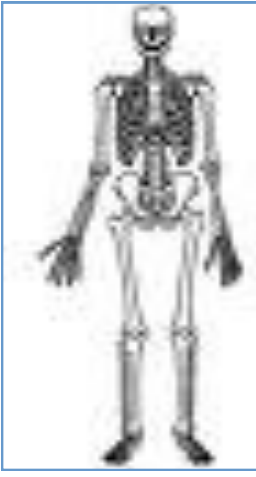
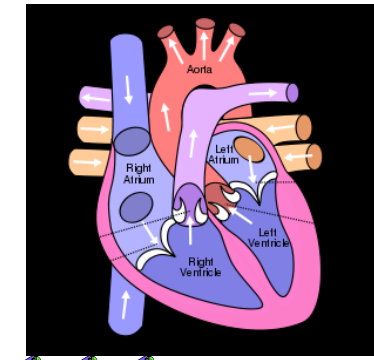


# Just to let you know...



This week the children have edited and improved their biographies working on quality writing. These now need to be written or typed up.

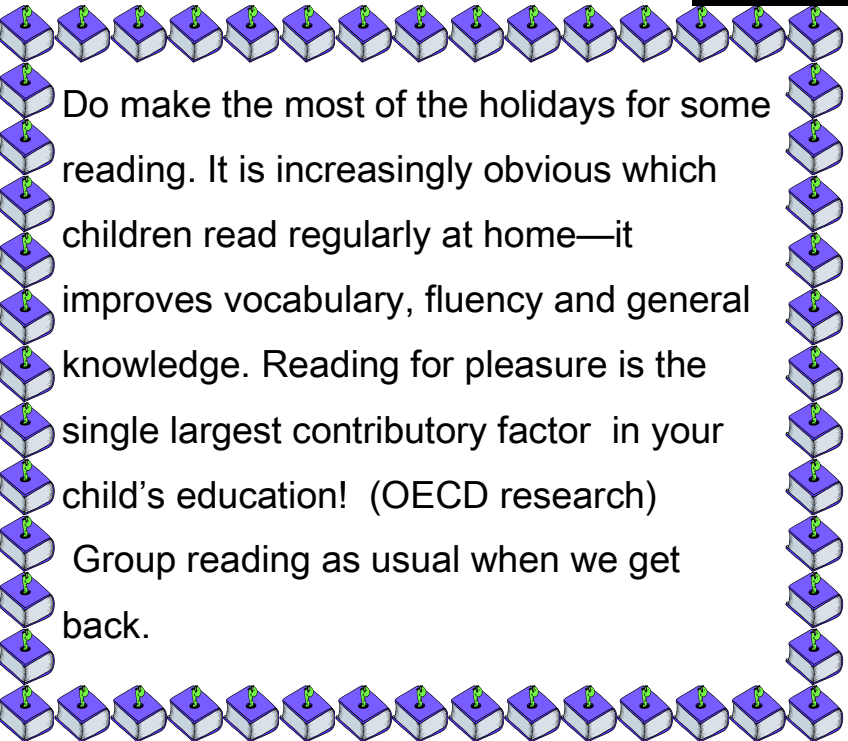
**Spellings: using -ies for plurals and verbs**
