# **Towns and Tides**

Year 5 Summer Term

In this term we consider our world through a field study, looking at our local area around Guildford and comparing and contrasting to a town in Spain, Tres Cantos.

The children go on an adventure of their own during our residential trip to Brenscombe Outdoor Centre, venturing back in history at Corfe Castle and considering the future at Lulworth Cove and Durdle Door.

We end the term, focusing on coastal erosion and the impact this has on different communities and stakeholders.

Explore key features of a UK coastline- arches, stacks, blowholes and caves

Learn how the sea and weather conditions shape the UK coast through the process of erosion
